Partnering Around Cancer Clinical Trials

Investigators at Wayne State University/Karmanos Cancer Institute are working to better understand and ultimately improve patient-doctor communication, particularly in men with prostate cancer. We are looking for prostate cancer survivors and their caregivers to serve on a special advisory panel as a part of an NIH-funded research study.

We want to recruit approximately 15 people from a variety of races and ethnicities to serve on the panel. We would like to talk with you about serving on this panel if you are a survivor of prostate cancer and you completed treatment within the last 5 years. We would also like to talk with you about serving on this panel if you were a caregiver of a prostate cancer patient who completed treatment within the last 5 years.

As a panel member, we will ask you to take part in both group and individual meetings that will take place in a conference room at the Karmanos Cancer Institute in Detroit. You will complete some online training modules, and then you will watch video recordings of real clinic visits between doctors and patients with prostate cancer, and discuss your thoughts about the way they communicated. As a prostate cancer survivor or caregiver, your experiences will provide us with critical input to better help us understand the complexities of patient-doctor communication.

Participation on the panel will take place over 6 months and take 17-21 hours of your time. **Panel members are not research participants**—panel members will be employed for this specific and temporary project by Wayne State University. The deadline to apply is December 1st, 2018. **As a panel member, you will earn \$750 over 6 months.**
