### **January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Self-Management Methods Addressing Anxiety, Stress, and Pain In All Client Populations.**

Presenter: Lawrence Collins, PhD

Location: Ascension Macomb-Oakland Hospital, Warren Campus Auditorium

Course Description: Identification of self-management skills and tools that will address anxiety, stress, and pain. The presentation will provide attendees with skills that they will use to educate their clients on how to de-escalate emotional flooding, reduce the fight, flight or freeze response to stress, as well as how to mitigate pain responses. These skills and tools are based on the Autogenic Training Model of Johanness Schultz MD, Edmund Jacobsen's Progressive Relaxation, as well as The Work of Byron Katie.

### **February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2019 Avoiding Burnout-Coping with Compassion Fatigue and Secondary Traumatic Stress.**

Course Description: The very act of providing empathy in the clinical setting can result in burnout, to say nothing of hearing clients' traumatic material and juggling the personal challenges in therapists' own lives. This presentation defines compassion, burnout, compassion fatigue, and secondary traumatic stress and includes a self-assessment to gauge how participants are coping in these areas. Participants will learn the ways to boost their sense of competence and prevent the impairment that can arise from burnout.

### **May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Stages of Change**

Course Description: The presentation provides a thorough explanation of the Stages of Change Model related to Substance Use Disorders, along with related clinical, family, and recovery considerations. For each Stage, there will be suggestions for identifying the Stage, general strategies for the clinician, and boundary considerations for the family. Steps for effective problem solving will be placed along side the Stages to demonstrate where that process has broken down in the early Stages

of Change (i.e. Pre-contemplation and Contemplation). 12-Step Recovery Principles necessary to move through the Stages will be highlighted.

**June 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019      Basic Human Needs/Why People Do What They Do, and How to Facilitate Change.**

Course Description: Attendees will gain knowledge as to what drives individuals to make the choices they make and the needs they are trying to meet through these choices. Also addressed will be the blocks and obstacles that arise as someone faces change and how these obstacles trigger deep shame, betrayal and rejection.

**July 26<sup>th</sup>, 2019      Managing Anger in Addiction and Mental Health**

Course Description: A strength-based approach to assisting patients in treatment and recovery towards resolving anger using Conflict Management Skills. All patients have strengths in resolving anger to some extent. This course will assist therapists in assessing strengths, determining risks to avoid aggression/abuse, and to facilitate increased cognitive behavioral skills using conflict resolution skills to resolve anger reducing the risk of relapse.

**August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2019      Stress, Trauma, and the socio-political impact of addiction in America: A Harm Reduction Model**

Presenter: Matthew Govier, LPC, CADC, CCTP, ADHD-CCSP

Location: Ascension Macomb-Oakland Hospital, Warren Campus Auditorium

Course Description: The presentation will outline the current accepted working definitions of addiction via ASAM, NIDA, and the APA. Stress and Trauma will be defined through the APA, DSM-5, Dr. Van der Kolk, and Dr. Peter Levine. The presentation of the overlap of longitudinal studies outlining stress rates in America and addiction's prevalence in America will be presented. Specific substances, such as alcohol, cannabis, and opioids, will be presented displaying their increase in use over time, and their connection to increased trauma and stress disorders in America. Harm Reduction treatment modalities along with compassionate care treatment interventions will be presented. The efficacy of best practices regarding treatment modalities will also be presented, to increase the awareness for providers.

**September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019      Understanding Addiction and Personality Disorders**

Location: Ascension Macomb-Oakland Hospital, Warren Campus Auditorium

Course Description: We will review the clusters of personality disorders, the development of each type, and how addiction correlates with each personality type. We will explore how treatment can meet the basic human needs of each client for connection, validation, and accountability.

**October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019      Treating Sexual Addiction and Pornography Addiction**

Location: Ascension Macomb-Oakland Hospital, Warren Campus Auditorium

Course Description: This course is an overview designed to raise awareness, knowledge, and treatments on the uncomfortable topics of sexual addiction and pornography addiction. Sexual addiction and pornography addiction are process addictions as opposed to chemical addiction that is characterized by out-of-control (compulsive) behaviors with marked consequences. Special attention will be paid to pornography addiction and the current neuroscience that reveals the effects of the brain.

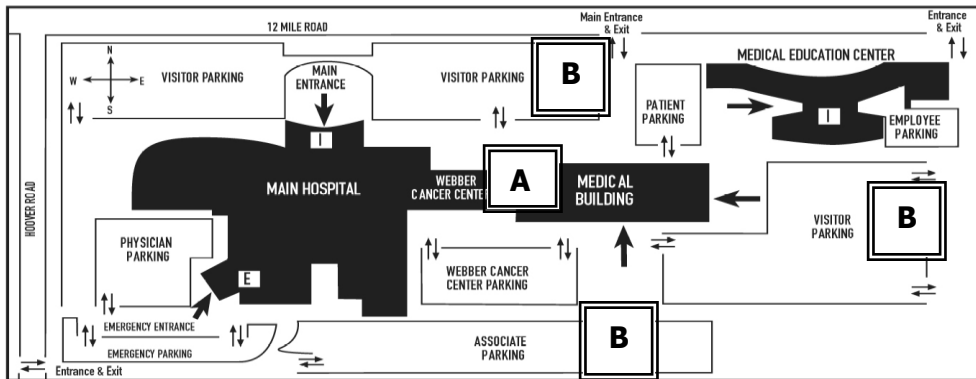
