James Henry, PhD

Dr. James Henry is co-founder and director of the Children’s Trauma Assessment Center (CTAC) at Western Michigan University. Dr. Henry CTAC is among the nation’s leading authorities on the identification and impacts of trauma in the lives of individuals, especially children. Under his leadership, CTAC has similarly developed to become a leading center for training mental health professionals in techniques for trauma identification and testing. He has a professional history that includes more than 17 years as a child welfare and protective services worker. He has been a professor in WMU’s School of Social Work for 15 years, with a focus on developing and providing trauma-informed instruction in the social work curriculum. He is a co-author of a book, “Seeking Justice,” which explores best models of system intervention in child sexual abuse. Dr. Henry has trained more than 50,000 professionals, caregivers, and community members on child maltreatment and trauma-informed practices.
